LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

In the early 2000s, Axis Health System made the decision to integrate primary and behavioral healthcare to care for the whole person. Today, that decision seems to have been prescient and obvious.

At the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, Shelly Burke, our CEO, advised our Board that we would have two health crises to address. The first was obvious, but the second was less so. What I did not understand was that the physical health protection measures associated with COVID-19 would contribute to increased social isolation and anxiety, triggering a secondary behavioral health crisis. As a result, the integration of care is more important than ever. During this same time, we experienced the "Great Resignation," political and international turmoil, and an uncertain economy. All of which continue to impact the health and well-being of our patients, our communities, and our world. The challenge for Axis has been how to prioritize and adapt as a community healthcare provider.

In response, Axis expanded our coresponder programs and capacity and increased our community training for suicide prevention and de-escalation across our entire 11-county region. We recently completed the planned expansion of the Cortez Integrated Healthcare clinic, adding a pharmacy, consolidating dental services, and increasing capacity for primary care and behavioral health. This year, Axis also acquired the former Mercury building in Durango to create a similar healthcare campus with expanded oral health, primary care, and behavioral health while adding space to increase community pharmacy access, which has been a longterm strategic goal for the Board.

So, what is next? Nobody knows for sure. But whatever challenges we face, I am confident our staff will continue our work to improve health outcomes and quality of life for our patients.

A WORD FROM THE CEO

Reflecting on the past year, I feel a profound sense of continued purpose and gratitude for the entire Axis Health System team. Despite the unprecedented whirlwinds impacting healthcare over the last several years, we continue to find opportunities for improvement that align with our mission, vision, and values. We remain committed to strengthening our continuum of care and evolving how we contribute to the health and well-being of our communities here in rural Colorado.



Recently our staff shared a story with me about a young person we served in one of our oral health clinics. This young patient had multiple dental issues that had not been addressed due to a series of prolonged financial challenges experienced by the family. Through a phased care approach, we addressed her dental needs over the course of a year while we also worked with the family to help them secure stable housing. Shortly after completing treatment, the patient's mother shared with us that the dental services had alleviated her child's chronic pain and the child's confidence was rebounding. The mother expressed relief and appreciation that her child was now doing much better physically, socially, and academically.

I share this story because a healthcare home that sees and treats its patients as individuals holds the potential to changes lives. For me, the heart of community-based healthcare is continuing to find better ways to respond to the healthcare needs of the whole person. No single system or provider can effectively address the entire continuum of care alone so we must work thoughtfully to close gaps where we can as well as collaborate with other key community partners and resources where we are able.

In this report, I believe you will see the depth and breadth of the impact we had this past year as we continue to focus on providing exceptional care that reduces health disparities, improves quality of life for our patients and positively impacts our communities. Together, our staff and our Board know that the work we do matters both in our clinics and in our communities.







IMPROVEMENTS & EXPANSION

CORTEZ INTEGRATED HEALTHCARE & REGIONAL CRISIS CENTER-MONTROSE





The Cortez Integrated Healthcare expansion project was completed. The clinic now has a drive through pharmacy for patients and the community and integrates oral health services which are identified needs in the community and improve our healthcare home model.

Facility improvements to support our crisis response capacity were also completed. The Regional Crisis Center – Montrose was renovated to improve the patient experience and capacity for our walk-in crisis services. Renovations were also completed at the Regional Crisis Center – Durango to accommodate the growth in crisis services and to improve our oncall respite program.

MEDICATION-ASSISTED TREATMENT (MAT) is now available throughout our 11-county region including streamlined access through our integrated primary care clinics.


